

Class Descriptions

1. **Horsemanship Class** - For those of you who love to dote on a favorite horse, this one is for you! A list of grooming points is available at the front desk.
2. **Adult Equitation** - open to all adult riders (18-plus yrs. old).
3. **Lead Line** - Open to children in MMW1 or W2 levels.
4. **Children's Beginner Jump** - Must be in CBJ1 level. Phase I - flat. Phase II - course of fences not to exceed 18".
5. **Adult Beginner Jump** - Open to adults in ABJ1 level. Phase I - flat. Phase II - course of fences not to exceed 18".
6. **Children's Intermediate Jump** - Open to children in CBJ2 level. Phase I - flat. Phase II - course of fences not to exceed 2'.
7. **Children's Advanced Jump** - Open to children in CBJ3 level. Phase I - flat. Phase II - course of fences not to exceed 2'3".
8. **Adult Intermediate/Advanced Jump** - Open to adults in ABJ2 level or above. Phase I - flat. Phase II - course of fences not to exceed 2'3".
9. **Child/Adult Intro to Jump** - Open to children and adults in Intro to Jump classes. Phase I - flat. Phase II - trot over ground poles.
10. **Show Team Medal II** - Proper attire required. 3 phases, each count 1/3 of your score: flat, jump, and a written test. Jumping and flat can be done on different horses. Must win Medal II to qualify for Medal I. Fence ht. 18" - 2'.
11. **Show Team Medal I** - Proper attire required. Requirements the same as Class 10. Fences not to exceed 2'3" to 2'6".
12. **Children's Advanced Flat** - Open to children in CBF3.
13. **Children's Intermediate Flat** - Open to children in CBF2+ for at least 2 sessions.
14. **Children's Beginner Flat** - Open to children in CBF2 level for at least 2 sessions.
15. **Short Stirrup walk/trot/canter** - Open to children in MMWTC and SS1 levels.
16. **Mini-Mite walk/trot/canter** - Open to children in MMWT2 level for at least 2 sessions.
17. **Mini-Mite walk/trot** - Open to children in MMWT for at least 2 sessions.

If only one rider signs up for a class, that class will either not be held, or the rider will be entered into the class closest to his current riding level.

You must enter a class at the level you are currently riding.
Management reserves the right to assign riders to the appropriate class.

Answers to Your Questions . . .

First and foremost, this is a FUN show!!! The Horse Center is a great place to socialize, and this show is designed for PHC students to do just that while participating in a little friendly competition! Enjoy a pleasant Sunday, meeting other folks who ride with us throughout the week.

Who can Participate?

ALL Potomac Horse Center students are encouraged to attend! Schooling shows are a great way to learn about showing in a no-pressure environment. Any first time "jitters" quickly disappear because you are familiar with the other horses and people around you.

Horse Choices and Availability

Although horse availability is on a first-come, first-served basis, we will do our best to accommodate you. It is highly recommended that you register early. Show application forms are at the front desk.

How Do I Register?

* Fill out the form on the back of this prize list COMPLETELY and have three horse choices. For minors, a parent signature is required.

* **Payment is required at the time of registration.** If you cancel after March 5, (show closing date), your entry fee is forfeited. Cancells received before this day will be allowed credit toward the next show (not toward lessons).

* Entries are for **one class only**. Riders wishing to enter a second class may enter the Horsemanship class.

Which Class Should I Enter?

Choose the class at your current lesson level. If you are not sure, talk to your instructor as to which class is the most appropriate. You may enter one class only.

What's the Deadline for Entries?

We suggest that you *sign up early!* Space is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Show entries will be accepted either until classes fill, or up to noon on **Wednesday, March 5** to allow us to organize the classes and prepare a time schedule. Please be aware that if only one rider is registered for a class, we will not hold that class, or that rider will be placed in a class closest to their current riding level.

WhatTime will I Ride?

Classes run in the order they appear on this prize list, but are subject to change. Please call the office on Saturday, March 8, to get your ride time and horse assignment. You should arrive at least a half-hour before your ride time to check in at the show office and prepare for your class.

What Should I Wear?

For all classes except the Show Team Medal classes, there is *no required* dress. You should **dress neatly** in a polo shirt or other collared shirt, tucked in. Boots, breeches and gloves are encouraged. Hair should be tied back or braided. Proper show attire descriptions are in the office.
